Greetings everyone,

On behalf of the Florida Fire Marshals and Inspectors Association, we present the agenda for the 2021 Miami Educational Seminar. Due to the on-going situation regarding COVID-19, this year's seminar will be done virtually.

In order to accommodate the maximum learning experience for students we will be hosting a series of webinars (see the schedule below) over a total of nine different days. Each day will be three hours in length for a total of 27 hours of training/CEUs. Students do not need to attend all days and all sessions but will only receive CEUS for the days/sessions they attend.

Select Course Descriptions:

Assisted Living Facilities: Florida Statute 429 changes provided an option to the current or 1994 edition of the Life Safety Code to be enforced in Assisted Living Facilities (ALF). The class will be a review of FI Statute 429 and explain, how the 2016 changes impact fire safety and fire inspections. Additionally, it will review the current and the 1994 editions of the Life Safety Code as well as review current and the 1995 editions of NFPA 101A. The class will also provide guidance to inspectors on items to look for during an inspection.

Emergency Communication Systems (ECS)/Mass Notification System (MNS) Basics, Intelligibility and Code Updates: This presentation will provide a basic introduction into mass notification and emergency communication systems as well as providing an overview of the key requirements in NFPA 72 and the 2015 and 2018 Model Codes.

Emergency Responder Radio Communications System (ERRCS): The Public Safety In-Building Radio Booster System Code Training course is designed to provide attendees with an understanding of the technologies, design considerations, and application of model fire codes and standards (International Fire Code and National Fire Protection Association Standards #72 & #1221) related to In-Building Public Safety RF Booster Systems. This version of the course places special focus on Florida Amendments to the code and topics known to be of interest in Florida.

Introduction to NFPA 770 Standard on Hybrid (Water and Inert Gas) Fire Extinguishing Systems: The purpose of this course is to provide learners with an overview of the new NFPA 770 Standard on Hybrid (Water and Inert Gas) Fire Extinguishing Systems and how hybrid technology is revolutionizing special hazard fire protection.

Mobile Food vendor Propane Safety: This class will discuss the following subjects: temporary food vendors, food trucks, and non-vehicle vendors along with the variety of installations an inspector may see, Propane cylinders, tanks, piping, appliances, codes and connections an inspector may see in the field, DOT transportation rules and regulations, FFMI Inspection rules and regulations and various fire codes for kitchen fire suppression and venting systems, and propane leak detection and mitigation. The class will explore the applicable aspects of NFPA 54 and NFPA 58 codes which cover the transportation and use of propane.

NFPA 13, 13R, 13D – Update: Upon completion of this course, each participant will understand the changes from the 2013 editions to the 2016 editions, including identifying the changes in the new editions, determining the meaning of new requirements in NFPA 13, 13D and 13R, understanding the meaning of the new requirements in NFPA 13, 13D, and 13R, understanding the issued Errata's associated with NFPA 13, 13D, and 13R, and identifying and understanding the Technical Interim Amendments (TIAs) associated with NFPA 13, 13D and 13R.

Summary of the New UL Smoke Detection Requirements: This presentation will provide a high-level overview of the new fire tests in the UL product standards as well as the reason for the new tests.
